Biblical Roots of Common Words and Phrases

Phrase: "A man after my own heart."

Meaning: Precisely to one's liking, a kindred spirit – someone I can agree with.

Origins: Considered a cliché since the late 19th century, this phrase appears in the Old Testament's First Book of Samuel (13:14) where we read, "The Lord hath sought him a man after his own heart, and the Lord hath commanded him to be captain over his people. (KSV) In this verse the Lord rejects King Saul and sends Samuel to David "a man after his own heart." Later God would promise David "Your throne shall be established forever." (2Sam 7:16) This phrase is repeated in Acts (13:22) where we read; "And when he had removed him (Saul), he raised up David to be their king, of whom he testified and said, 'I have found in David the son of Jesse a man after my own heart, who will do all my will.'" Note: David was not perfect, but he set his heart on doing God's will, and repented when he failed.
